The General Practice Assistant Training Programme is here!

BHR CEPN Training Hub has developed a training programme to support General Practice Assistants to become accredited in their role. The training programme has been developed to ensure each GPA has access to quality and consistent training, so they are able to support the GP(s) smooth running of clinics by performing the more routine administration and clinical tasks on behalf of the GP freeing up their time to focus on the patient.

The training programme requires 1 day of training per week, over a period of 6 - 9 months. It includes:

An induction meeting to take you and your GPA trainee through the training programme and e-portfolio

- Suggested week-by-week training programme including e-Learning modules, face to face opportunities and in practice training
- Access to the Google Classroom for all your e-portfolio needs
- Monthly Peer Support meetings to connect with your peers across BHR
- GP Mentor training guide and Ongoing support from your Training Hub Lead.

Accredited Multi-professional Supervision Course For Educators in Primary Care

The Primary Care School and Faculty Development Team within NHS England's Workforce Training and Education Directorate are delighted to announce a new Multi-professional Supervision Course for Primary Care.

The course consists of four study days held over a three-month period:

- Study day 1: Course introduction, preparing to teach and facilitate in the workplace.
- Study day 2: Understanding and navigating the challenges to supervision.
- Study day 3: Core concepts in lesson planning and teaching, Interprofessional education and assessment.
- Study day 4: Peer review, portfolio review and discussion, next steps.

Following successful completion of the course, and assessment, attendees can then progress to apply to be recognised as an Educator via the nationally agreed Primary Care Educator and Educational Environment Recognition process. This is managed at scale through your Training Hub.

Please note that this is not a GP Trainer Course.

This is a 4-day face-to-face course which commences in September. Course dates are:

Training Workshops Identifying and referring 'hidden' carers



The London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in partnership with Carers of Barking and Dagenham invite partners across the Council, Health, Community and Voluntary Sector to attend **free training** to help identify 'hidden' carers and understand how to support and refer them to the Carers' Hub.

Around 14,224 people identify themselves as carers in Barking and Dagenham, however only 4,500 are known to services. These 'hidden' Carers also known as informal or unpaid carers who often don't have any help or support.

By identifying carers and referring them to the Carers' Hub these carers can access timely information, advice and support.


Becoming An Anti-Racist Health & Care System



The UK is recognised worldwide as a leader in genomics and the unique structure of the NHS is allowing the delivery of genomic advances at scale and pace for patient benefit. As part of NHS England's (NHSE) strategy to establish a national Genomics Medicine Service (GMS), building on the success of the 100,000 Genomes Project, NHS England has commissioned seven genomic laboratory hubs (GLHs) each responsible for coordinating genomic and genetic testing services for a particular part of the country, including the start of whole genome sequencing.
