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Primary care

Launch of NHS Pharmacy First advanced service

Yesterday (31 January 2024), the NHS Pharmacy First advanced service launched, enabling community pharmacists to complete episodes of care for patients for seven common conditions, without the need for the patient to visit their general practice. The service builds on the previous Community Pharmacist Consultation Service (CPCS) by enabling community pharmacies to manage patients for seven common conditions, following specific clinical pathways. Thank you to all pharmacies who have signed up.

Chief Pharmacutical Officer for England, David Webb, has recorded a message for the profession, thanking more than 10,000 pharmacies who have registered to deliver the service to date.

General practice staff should continue to refer using the same processes as for CPCS. For the

first two to four weeks, consultation information will be received via NHSMail, as per usual practice. By the end of February, systems will have been updated so that the information can be reviewed by GP practices in the clinical system and added to the patient record with one click of a button.

MMR vaccination update

Due to <u>rising measles cases in the West Midlands and London</u>, NHS England has launched a <u>catch-up campaign to increase MMR vaccination coverage</u>, <u>particularly in low uptake areas</u>. The public is advised to check their or their child's vaccination status. This can be via the Red Book or the NHS app (or their GP practice).

To support this, the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has released <u>easy-read materials on</u> <u>measles symptoms and actions</u> and a <u>slide set for primary care</u>. <u>MMR materials can be</u> <u>downloaded and ordered for free on the health publications website</u>.

From February to March 2024, national MMR call and recall reminders will be sent to unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals aged 6-11 years across England, and 6-25 years in specific regions. These reminders will prompt patients to check their MMR immunisation status and, if vaccination is required, to contact general practice and in some areas local school age immunisation providers for vaccination.

Digital prescriptions in the NHS App

As of 30 January 2024, patients in England can use the NHS App to view all their prescription details, order repeat prescriptions, and generate a barcode that can be shown to a pharmacy for collection without a paper prescription from their GP. This will positively impact on general practice workload as each repeat prescription ordered electronically saves GP practices three minutes of time, with those ordered using the app expected to save the equivalent of 1.85 million hours in 2024.

Guidance: GP direct access to diagnostic testing for respiratory and heart conditions

Guidance has been published to enhance GP direct access to tests for Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), asthma, and heart failure. Supporting the NHS' winter initiatives and the Long Term Plan ambitions, this guidance supports systems to build the capacity and capability needed for spirometry, FeNO and NT-proBNP tests to achieve quicker diagnoses for patients.

Giving patients online access to new GP health record entries

The digital transformation programme for online prospective record access completes on 31 March. Direct practice support is now being taken forward by local commissioners which have devolved responsibility for GP contract management and enforcement. 83% of GP practices now offer full online prospective record access by default.
