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# 1. 2023/24 Prescribing Quality and Efficiency Scheme Payment Update

The NEL ICB Pharmacy and Medicines Optimisation Team have received a few queries from practices regarding the timelines for the payment of the 2023/24 PQES. # 2. NEL Formulary and Pathways Update

### • GLP-1 RA shortage protocol for Type 2 Diabetes (update)

# 3. QIPP Focus: Cost-effective Option for Levonorgestrel 20microgram/24hours IUDS (Benilexa®)

Benilexa<sup>®</sup> One Handed (Levonorgestrel 20mcg/24hrs) Intrauterine Delivery System (IUDS) has been approved across NEL to be used (in place of Mirena<sup>®</sup>) as the **first line choice** for contraception and heavy menstrual bleeding as it is the most cost-effective option at £71.

### Action for Practices that directly order and administer IUDSs as a personally administer item:

The NEL Pharmacy and Medicines Optimisation Team and the Practice Support Dietitian team are delivering training on the new <u>ONS NEL Guidance</u>.

This targeted training for PCN and practice pharmacists and dietitians, focuses on MUST scores, Food First approaches, and oral nutrition supplements for patients. The training is in alignment with the recently published NEL ONS guidelines.

In addition to that, these sessions will cover the referral pathway to dieticians, ensuring a comprehensive training experience.

The new NEL ONS guidance requires that PCN pharmacists are appropriately trained by a Practice Support Dietitian before reviewing ONS patients.

Attendance at these online sessions will enable the PCN pharmacists to support community and care home reviews.
