One year anniversary of the Delivery Plan for Recovering Access to Primary Care

Today (9 May) marks one year since the publication of the Delivery Plan for Recovering Access to Primary Care, which aims to make it easier and more convenient for patients to get the help they need from primary care and reduce pressure on staff.

Thanks to primary care teams, huge progress has been made on delivering improvements, which have included rolling out the biggest expansion of community pharmacy services in years; training thousands of people in practice reception teams in care navigation skills; and supporting the majority of practices in upgrading to digital telephony systems. Delivery Plan for Recovering Access to Primary Care: boosting awareness of the multidisciplinary team

As part of NHS England's communications campaign to raise awareness of the multi-disciplinary team working in primary care, a new animated film has been developed to explain the additional roles for multicultural audiences. The animation has been translated into multiple languages (Hindi, Panjabi, Gujarati, Bengali, Polish, Romanian and Somali) to reach those who have low proficiency English and/or literacy levels and uses simple, straightforward language to ensure understanding amongst our target groups. Primary care

New 'how to' guides to support modern general practice

As part of the Delivery Plan for Recovering Access to Primary Care, NHS England has published four 'how to' guides to support general practice teams to:

- better align capacity with need
- improve care navigation
- improve telephony journeys
- improve care-related processes

The guides provide know-how and learning from practices and primary care networks (PCNs) across the country about tested new systems, processes and approaches that are helping the transformation to modern general practice. They complement the existing 'creating highly usable and accessible GP website for patients' guide and support practices and PCNs to adapt this shared knowledge to their local context and realise benefits more quickly and easily.

Supporting uptake of pertussis vaccination

Pertussis cases are rising. Recorded vaccination uptake during pregnancy is falling and is now at its lowest in seven years.

Practices are reminded of the clinical importance this vaccination offers, including to newborn babies. In line with contractual requirements, practices are to offer and provide pertussis vaccination to eligible patients, including on request, and correctly code in medical records the vaccination event regardless of where it was administered. Practices are encouraged to work within their PCNs during core and enhanced hours to provide vaccination and to work within their local systems through their vaccination lead to support uptake.
