You will train as an Academic GP Fellow in health data science, research methods, and the clinical effectiveness approach, to develop into future leaders delivering clinical improvements in primary care across North East London. Successful applicants will be matched to, and provide clinical services in, a GP practice in Barking, Dagenham or Havering, and develop their research skills as part of the Clinical Effectiveness Group (CEG) in the Wolfson Institute of Population Health (WIPH)'s Centre for Primary Care, QMUL. You will train and add academic depth to the CEG, working with Primary Care across North East London to secure the best Quality Outcome Framework, with research into enhanced risk prediction and disease prediction around QRisk models.
