## An allergy focused history;

- Presenting complaint
- Family history of atopy
- Personal history of atopy
- Previous exposure
- Frequency, duration and repeatability of symptoms
- How is child fed?
- Any food exclusions for any reason?

## Examine

Other signs of atopy?

• Growth; measure and plot

• ? Malnutrition

• ? Anaemia

## IgE or Non-IgE mediated allergy?

	IgE mediated	Non IgE mediated
Onset	Within minutes	2-72 hrs after ingestion/contact
Mild to Moderate	Pruritis, erythema, uriticaria/angioedema Nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, colicky abdominal pain  Upper airways; rhinitis, sneezing Lower airways; tight chest, wheeze, cough, short of breath	Pruritis, erythema, eczema  Reflux, constipation, diarrhoea, blood and mucus in stool, perianal erythema, colicky pain, food refusal, pallor and tiredness  Upper airways; rhinitis, sneezing Lower airways; tight chest, wheeze, cough, short of breath
Severe	anaphylaxis	Severe and persisting, growth may falter
