



We are seeking a **Clinical Lead** to work in partnership with **nia** on **IRIS** across GP practices in **Hackney & City** (*4 hours per month*).

nia [About nia - NIA | Ending Violence Against Women and Girls](#) is seeking a local, practising clinician (ideally a GP) with an interest in domestic violence and abuse (DVA) to become the Clinical Lead for our **IRIS Programme in Hackney & City**. The **IRIS** service in Hackney & City is well established and has been operational since its trial in 2007-2010.

IRIS is an evidence-based domestic abuse training and referral programme developed specifically for general practice, currently being delivered across England and Wales. For more information on the **IRIS** programme: <https://irisi.org/about-the-iris-programme/>

We are looking for practicing clinicians with knowledge of local needs and with links to local primary health care staff. The **IRIS** Clinical Lead role will involve working closely with our Women's Health Services manager and Advocate Educator to deliver the **IRIS** programme across the area, support delivery of training to the practices, and to support the service to act as a source of advice and guidance to clinicians about DVA.

The **IRIS** Clinical Lead will understand the gendered nature of DVA, and of the impact of multiple, intersecting oppressions (e.g. sexism, racism, homophobia, ableism, etc) and the consequent barriers for survivors of DVA to accessing health and other services.

The role requires approximately **4 hours per month** at an hourly rate of **£83**. We are looking for practitioners willing to attend the **IRIS** training for trainers, funded through the service. A small proportion of the time will be spent supporting the **IRIS** Advocate Educator to deliver the **IRIS** clinical one training to local general practice teams. We have funding confirmed up until March 2026, this is a fixed envelope of funding for the role.
