



Academic GP Advanced Fellowship Programme

This pioneering new training programme, a partnership between **Queen Mary University of London (QMUL)** and the **North East London Integrated Care Board**, is recruiting 20 GP Fellows nationally to work in a full-time role; 50:50 in academic and clinical practice, for up to 5 years.

The programme will train GP Fellows in health data science, research methods, and the clinical effectiveness approach, to develop them into future leaders delivering clinical improvements in primary care across North East London. Successful applicants will be matched to, and provide clinical services in, a GP practice in **Barking & Dagenham, Havering, Newham or Redbridge**; developing their research skills as part of the **Clinical Effectiveness Group (CEG)** in the Wolfson Institute of Population Health (WIPH)'s Centre for Primary Care, QMUL.
