BHRUT – EPR Go Live Summary for GP Practices

BHRUT goes live with the new Electronic Patient Record (EPR) on 8 November.

Here's what GP practices need to know:

1. Data Pause - London Care Record (LCR)

- 1 week pause in new data flowing from BHRUT into the LCR.
- Historical data still viewable.

2. Discharge Summaries & Letters

- Created via EPR: structured, consistent, and includes coded data.
- New look similar to Barts Health letters.

3. Pathology Requests

GP Requests

- Continue using CyberLab (unchanged).
- CyberLab upgrades coming soon for easier use.
- Support: bhrut.pathology.helpdesk@nhs.net / bhrut.gpliaison@nhs.net

Hospital Requests

- Patients must attend BHRUT sites for hospitalrequested bloods.
- Results visible as usual in CyberLab.

4. MESH (Message Exchange for Social Care and Health) Integration

 Work underway with EMIS for direct transfer of clinic letters via MESH. Not coming in with go live.

5. Radiology

- GP requesting process unchanged.
- Action for Practice Managers by 03 November 2025:
 - A "drop-in" Teams invitation for a walkthrough on adding a new trading partner to EMIS will be sent. SystemOne will receive separate invites
 - Please confirm receipt by 03 November 2025 to ensure continued electronic delivery of GP-referred radiology reports after 08 November 2025.

6. DNAR / Resuscitation Plans

- DNACPR/TEP plans remain valid in the community - unchanged.
- Will accompany patient in paper form on discharge or transfer from our hospitals.

7. Hospital Prescribing

- At go live BHRUT will transition from paper drug charts to Electronic Prescribing & Medicines Administration (EPMA).
- GPs will receive clearer, structured medication lists showing:
 - New, discontinued, and continued medication with rationale.
- Outpatients & A&E are using CLEO for one-off eprescriptions to be sent to the patient's nominated pharmacy.

8. Specialty Contact Details

- We plan to add phone and email addresses to clinic letters as part of the optimisation phase after go live.
- There is a document on the BHRUT website <u>contact-details-for-bhrut-specialities</u> with contact details for many of our specialities. The plan is for the list to be updated regularly.

9. Referring during the transition

- Continue referring patients for secondary care as usual.
- Where possible, use alternative services such as Advice & Guidance (A&G) and Advice & Refer (A&R) to ease the pressure on the hospitals during the go live transition.
