# To: All GP Practices in North East London Subject: Launch of NEL Community Anticoagulation Service – Important Information

### Dear Colleagues,

We are pleased to update you on the upcoming launch of the North East London (NEL) Community Anticoagulation Service, which will provide a single, streamlined model across NEL.

## **Key points for GP practices:**

- Patient Handover:
  - New providers are collaborating with existing providers to ensure the safe transfer of patients to the new service provider.
  - Transfer of patient clinical information will primarily occur via the INR Star platform.
  - In Newham, the transfer will be a manual process due to a different dosing system used by the current service providers.

#### Your Role:

- Please approve any data-sharing requests from the new provider of the service promptly to avoid breaks in continuation of care.
- If contacted by patients with any concerns including details of their next appointment, please signpost the patient to the correct provider as clinical responsibility remains with the current provider until the go-live date (see Table below).

The full-service specification was approved in July 2025 following extensive stakeholder engagement and clinical review and is available on the Primary Care Portal here.

## **Important Changes:**

- Patient Specific Directions (PSDs):
  - o PSDs will not be used in the new service, due to repeated patient safety incidents.
  - For patients in Barking, Dagenham, Redbridge, and Havering, please ensure warfarin is added to repeat prescription lists, as you would for patients seen in acute care.
- EMIS Integration:
  - Automatic write-back to EMIS is a requirement of the new service, ensuring INR
    results and dose changes are communicated in real time. Please agree data sharing
    as requested by the new service provider.
- Management of excursions of INR
  - This will be managed by the anticoagulation clinic including any requirement to prescribe low molecular weight heparin or vitamin K. Link to guidance here
- DOAC switching
  - New providers are required to switch suitable patients with non-valvular atrial fibrillation to a DOAC. Once stabilised on a DOAC, patients will be discharged to the care of their GP.

Given the short turnaround time for mobilisation, in some boroughs the full choice of clinics may not be available for patients on 1st January however patients will still have access to a clinic in their borough.
