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## 1. SS26 COVID-19 Vaccination Campaign – one week to go – **FOR INFORMATION AND ACTION**

The Spring 2026 COVID-19 vaccination programme starts on Monday 13 April. Here is what you need to do before then.

### Complete your site acknowledgement page

If you haven't already done so, log into the FDP Supply Dashboard and complete the site acknowledgement page. You'll need to confirm your site lead contact details and fridge capacity and click 'Accept'. You cannot place vaccine orders until this step is complete, so please do this as a matter of urgency. Contact your [ICB](#) if your site address appears incorrect.

### Order your vaccine now

Vaccine will not arrive automatically- you must place your order through the FDP Supply Dashboard. If you haven't ordered yet, do so today. Choose a delivery date that suits your clinic schedule and order only what you need for your planned activity in the coming days. Your campaign entitlement and available allocation are visible in the dashboard.

### Submit a stocktake if you've already received vaccine

If vaccine has already been delivered to your site, you must submit a stocktake on the FDP Supply Dashboard before you can place further orders. Stocktakes must be completed at least once every 7 days throughout the campaign. Providers that have never received vaccine do not need to submit a stocktake before their first order.

### **TDM is now live**

The Targeted Deployment Model (TDM) went live on 8 April. For sites with National Booking Service (NBS) visibility, TDM will automatically increase your available allocation when vaccination activity exceeds your original forecast. You will need to log in and place orders manually when your allocation increases.

### **Other actions before 13 April**

- Make sure appointment slots are open and visible on the National Booking Service from 13 April (publicly visible from 7 April)
- Dispose of any old variant vaccine stock as per your local guidance and set stocktake balances for decommissioned vaccines to zero on FDP Site Stock Manager
- Check that trained staff are available to receive deliveries throughout the delivery day, not just during the estimated window
- Review the provider guide and training resources on the V&S Futures workspace if you need a refresher on the new ordering model
