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1. Nuvaxovid allocation update – FOR INFORMATION

SS26 COVID-19 Vaccination Campaign – Nuvaxovid JN.1 Allocation Available from Wednesday 27 May 2026

From Wednesday 27 May 2026, all providers will be able to request an allocation of Nuvaxovid JN.1 (Sanofi), which they can then order through the FDP Supply Dashboard with deliveries available from Monday 1 June 2026.

Providers should not order Nuvaxovid for the purpose of running allergy clinics or vaccinating patients with a history of allergic reactions to COVID-19 vaccines. Patients with prior allergic reactions to COVID-19 vaccines, or a history of anaphylaxis to other medicines or vaccines, should be directed to their local allergy pathway in line with Table 5 of the Green Book, Chapter 14a.

Key ordering reminders

- Orders must be placed through the FDP Supply Dashboard; a stocktake submitted within the previous 7 days is required before ordering
- Order quantities aligned to confirmed or planned activity; avoid bulk ordering
- Smaller Spikevax pack sizes (10, 20, 30 doses) remain available for sites with lower or variable demand

2. Detained Estate Vaccination Learning Programme Webinar 1 – FOR INFORMATION

Detained Estate Vaccination Learning Programme Webinar 1

Thursday 18 June 2026 | 12:30 – 14:00

Join us for an interactive and informative national webinar delivered by EPIC Consultants in partnership with NHS England and system partners. The session will bring together colleagues working across health and detained settings to share learning from a nationally commissioned project focused on improving understanding of vaccinations within secure and detained estates.

The webinar will explore how improving understanding through informed consent can support increased confidence and uptake of vaccinations among children, young people and adults in detained settings.

The webinar will provide the opportunity to hear from colleagues involved in this nationally commissioned project including:

- Findings from a scoping and review of existing vaccination information and engagement assets used within detained settings
- Insights gathered through engagement with children, young people, adults and staff across secure and detained estates
- The development of revised and new co-produced resources tailored specifically for detained settings
- Evaluation findings on the impact of co-produced assets on understanding, confidence and vaccination uptake intent
- Key recommendations to support improved vaccination engagement and informed consent across detained settings
- Applying the learning in practice

The webinar will conclude with a Q&A session and reflections from the panel.
