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1. Publications related to 2026/27 flu vaccination programme – FOR INFORMATION

The following publications are currently available to support regions and providers with the upcoming flu programme for Autumn / Winter 2026/27.

Please see below the flu resources updates ahead of the 2026 to 2027 season.

There are 3 specific products produced by UKHSA each season to support training for the flu immunisation programme:

1). The national flu immunisation programme for 2026 to 2027 slide set.

2). Flu immunisation e-learning programme

- This is an interactive [flu immunisation e-learning programme](#), written by UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), and produced by Health Education England's e-Learning for Healthcare (an external provider). It is available for anyone involved in delivering the flu immunisation programme. UKHSA has supplied all of the materials needed for the 2026 to 2027 season and we expect this to go live in the coming days. When they do go live, it will be navigable from the [2026 to 2027 annual flu collection](#). Training for flu vaccinators should be undertaken in line with the recommendations made in the [National Minimum Standards and Core Curriculum for Vaccination Training](#).

3). Flu vaccination programme 2026 to 2027: healthcare practitioners

2. Transition from Alloga to Movianto (MUK) – Update to COVID-19 vaccine distribution – FOR INFORMATION AND ACTION

We are writing to inform you of an upcoming change to our vaccine distribution service impacting deliveries of COVID-19 vaccine. We will be transitioning from our current provider, Alloga, to Movianto, and we want to ensure you have all the information you need to plan ahead and avoid any disruption to your vaccine supply.

Key dates for your diary:

- Tuesday 28 July – Last orders placed for delivery on Friday 31 July to cover the period from Monday 03 August to Monday 10 August (standard cut-off times apply)
- Friday 31 July – Final deliveries by Alloga
- Monday 3 August to Monday 10 August – No year-round pathway deliveries
- Thursday 6 August – First orders with Movianto to be placed for delivery on Tuesday 11 August
- Tuesday 11 August – First Movianto deliveries (subject to demand)

Important:

Due to system limitations, FDP will continue to show delivery dates between 03 to 10 August as available for selection. However, no physical deliveries can take place during this period due to the change in vaccination distribution service. Any orders raised for delivery 03 to 10 August will be denied on the Supply Dashboard and will not be fulfilled.

3. Vaccination and pregnancy webinar – FOR INFORMATION

UKHSA has worked with the Royal College of Midwives (RCM) to organise a Vaccines webinar. This is a 90-minute webinar focussing on vaccination in pregnancy and the postnatal period and will be of interest to anyone involved in commissioning or delivering the programmes. You do not need to be a member of the RCM to register for this event. Once registered a booking link will be sent out to you 24 hours before the event begins.

4. Reminder to sign up to the seasonal vaccination service for the autumn/winter campaign 2026/27 - **FOR INFORMATION AND ACTION**

General practices and community pharmacies not already signed up to the autumn/winter COVID-19 and/or flu campaign should sign up by 31 July 2026, to guarantee the delivery of COVID-19 vaccine before the start of the campaign.

Providers already signed up for the services do not need to take further action.

Provider	COVID, adult flu and child flu service requirements
GP practices	- Enhanced service specification is here - Practices wishing to offer the service should accept both the COVID-19 and flu offers on CQRS - GPs wishing to participate in the AW26 campaign must complete this national form: General Practice Seasonal Vaccination Programme 2026-27 registration and data capture form and accept CQRS. - GPs who have already submitted the offer via CQRS and registered to the 2026/27 Enhanced Service Specification do not need to take further action. - GPs who have previously registered but now wish to opt out can withdraw using the same national form. - GPs who do not wish to participate but need to claim payment for subcontracting or DES purposes must accept CQRS for payment only and do not need to complete the national form.
Community pharmacies	- Advanced service specification is here - Sign up is available via Manage Your Service (MYS Portal)
All providers System access requests (FDP, MYA)	Use the Vaccination Provider System Access Request to request access
Community pharmacies RAVS onboarding	Providers can self-onboard to RAVS via “Select your pharmacy - NHS Record a vaccination”. All community pharmacies must have a RAVS account for the AW26 programme to record all NHS vaccinations.
